Receipt of abstracts will be acknowledged.

Abstracts of accepted papers will be distributed during the Conference.

Please note: It is compulsory for **presenters** of papers and special sessions to **register in advance** (before 20 June 2002).

ACCOMMODATION

Single rooms will be available in Rhodes University residences at approx. R125 per person, including breakfast. A limited number of twin rooms will also be available at R125 per person.

Lunch and dinner will cost about R20-25.

Alternatively, Grahamstown has many B&Bs and hotels. A list of these, with 2001 prices, can be found on the city's official web site: <http://www.grahamstown.co.za/> The site also contains tourist information about the city and surrounding area.

TRAVEL INFORMATION

Grahamstown is situated in the East Cape countryside, about 1½ hours drive from Port Elizabeth. Shuttle buses will meet selected flights to Port Elizabeth (PE) on Sunday 7 July and make a number of return trips to PE on 10 July and 11 July. Car hire is available at PE airport.

NATIONAL ARTS FESTIVAL

The conference takes place following the 2002 National Arts Festival (scheduled for 28 June - 6 July 2002). Why not come a few days early and enjoy the entertainment? Rooms in University residences will be available during the Festival at rates similar to those for the Conference. (Prices for hotels and B&Bs rise steeply during the Festival.) Transport from PE airport during the Festival period can be booked through the Festival office.

BOOKING DATES

Early booking is advised. Accommodation in Rhodes residences should be booked **by 7 June 2002**. Anyone wanting to stay in Rhodes accommodation during the Festival should try to book by 1 May, the date booking opens to the general public. Further information will be given in the next Circular.
