2. KEYNOTE SPEAKERS

International speaker: Prof Myriam Vermeerbergen, Linguistics Research Unit, KU Leuven



Topic: Sign Language Lexicography - Challenges and/as Opportunities **Short biography:**

Myriam Vermeerbergen is Professor of (Sign) Linguistics at KU Leuven (Belgium), where she and her deaf colleagues have established a unique academic teaching programme in Flemish Sign Language (VGT) and VGT interpreting.

In the early 1990s, Myriam pioneered sign language research in Flanders, Belgium, and in 1996 she obtained a PhD with a thesis on morpho-syntactic aspects of VGT. As a post-doctoral researcher, she continued her work on the grammar of VGT and also studied the similarities between the grammars of different sign languages (including South African Sign Language) and between sign languages and other forms of gestural communication. She spent several months in South Africa, researching "homesigning", the gestural form of communication used by deaf people who have not acquire or learnt a full-fledged spoken or signed language.

As one of the few sign language experts in Flanders, Myriam has been involved in a wide range of studies on different aspects of sign languages and Deaf communities, including research on sign language teaching, sign language interpreting and sociolinguistic and lexicographical research the digital bilingual dictionary (resulting in first of Flemish Sign Language (https://woordenboek.vlaamsegebarentaal.be). Currently, Myriam is also a PI in the European Horizon2020 project SignON (https://signon-project.eu).

Myriam is co-founder and former chairperson of the Flemish Sign Language Centre, recognised by the Flemish Government as a "knowledge and coordination centre for Flemish Sign Language" (www.vgtc.be) and the current vice-chair of the Advisory Committee on Flemish Sign Language.

Africa speaker: Prof. Thapelo Otlogetswe, Professor of Linguistics and Lexicography, University of Botswana



Topic: Making African dictionaries African

Short biography:

Thapelo J Otlogetswe is a professor of Linguistics and Lexicography and a recipient of the Presidential Order of Honour (PH) being an honour awarded for efficient and devoted service to the Republic of Botswana. Between 2019-2020 he was a Fulbright visiting professor in the Linguistics Department of the University of California, Davis.

His principal areas of interest are corpus linguistics and lexicography. Much of his research is in lexical computing, corpus lexicography, onomastics, rhyming patterns, genre and text type analysis. He has been involved in the development of Setswana spellcheckers and the compilation of a multi-million token Setswana corpus.

He has also compiled a number of dictionaries including *Tlhalosi ya Medi ya Setswana*, *English-Setswana Dictionary*, *Oxford English Setswana Setswana English School Dictionary* and *Poeletso-medumo ya Setswana: a Setswana Rhyming dictionary*. He has led the breakthrough translation work on the Setswana Google Search, OpenOffice and Firefox Setswana Spell-checkers. He is a member of the African Association of Lexicography and of the African Academy of Languages - which is a languages arm of the African Union. He also sits on the editorial boards of multiple academic journals.

Working with a sign language is very different to working with spoken languages, more so than just the medium. This workshop will go into detail on the process followed by the National Institute for the Deaf to create a bilingual South African Sign Language-English video glossary.

Presenter: Dirkie Ebersohn, Content Development Manager at the National Institute for the Deaf Sign Language Centre



Presenter's bio:

Dirkie Ebersohn was born Deaf and embraces his native language, South African Sign Language (SASL), and culture. As a learner, he attended the De la Bat School in Worcester, where he completed his matric.

Beginning his career as an artist, he migrated to digital media and applied his skills to increasing access for Deaf people through specially adapted graphical media.

He is currently employed as Content Development Manager at the National Institute for the Deaf's Sign Language Centre in Worcester, South Africa. In this capacity, he is primarily responsible for the development of our South African Sign Language Video Dictionary. Thousands of SASL videos are available in this resource, based on scientific data collection. Deaf himself, he aims to improve SASL resources from a linguistic perspective.

Currently he is also studying at the University of Witwatersrand, Johannesburg - Arts Occasional Undergraduate Studies, which includes modules such as Introductory Linguistics, Sociolinguistics, and Poetry & Storytelling, all in SASL.
